FROM MINISTERIAL SERVICES

Special Film to Be Viewed Nationwide

Plans are now complete for distribution of the special film that Mr. Herbert Armstrong wants shown to all the churches in the U.S. The film, as you recall from last week's Pastor General's Report, is Mr. Armstrong's March 7th, 79-minute sermon to the Southern California churches, transmitted by microwave from Tucson.

All U.S. pastors should have already been informed when the film is to be shown in their churches, who will be sending it to them, and where they will need to ship it for the next Sabbath's viewing.

Please be assured that we want this project to run as smoothly and efficiently as you do. It is our desire that you have complete confidence in all of the details—without any doubts or confusion whatsoever. If there is anything that you need clarification on, please don't hesitate to call Andre Zick at Ministerial Services for assistance.

A checklist and instruction reminder will be included in each film case.

SHIPPING PROCEDURES: The entire success of this project lies, for the most part, with the shipping procedures. We need to guarantee that each film reaches the next church area on time for Sabbath services the following week.

Ideally, of course, it would be wise to <u>hand deliver</u> the film--where feasible--from one church area to the next. However, since this is not always possible, shipping the film becomes necessary.

Whatever method you use, BE PROMPT. Ship the film to the next church area as soon as possible.

In most cases, U.P.S. will do the job adequately at a moderate cost-especially if the area you are shipping to is nearby. U.P.S. has the advantage that an immediate trace can be put on the film if it does happen to get lost. However, if you are in an area where you know the service is poor, or you need to ship the film long distances, EXPRESS MAIL can be used. EXPRESS MAIL often guarantees overnight delivery between many metropolitan centers for a price of \$10 to \$20. In certain extreme cases, it may be necessary to send the film by an air freight service—such as EMERY EXPRESS or AIRBORNE. (However, this situation will probably be very rare.) The cost for air freight service averages \$25. If in doubt, or if you have any questions whatsoever as to how you should ship the film, please contact Dave Simpson at the Shipping and Warehousing Department in Pasadena.

The last church scheduled to view each film should ship it promptly back to Pasadena (in care of Ambassador Television Productions--300 West Green Street, Pasadena, California 91123). U.P.S. will be adequate for this purpose.

FILM SPLICING: The films being used are of high quality. With normal use and proper handling, each copy should have a very long life span. However, should a break in the film occur, have it taken to a local camera store, or to a high school or college where you know a lot of quality processing work is done, or to any competent person that you can be sure is capable of doing a professional splice. If the splice is done properly, it will not impair the quality of the film to a significant degree.

Finally, we know that with our combined diligence, teamwork, and cooperation, this operation will be a smashing success!

(Pastors outside the U.S. will be contacted by their regional directors regarding the showing of the film in their areas.)

Guidelines for "Night to Be Much Observed"

Recently several pastors asked whether they should have one large congregational group meal for the "Night to be Much Observed," or have the members continue to observe this occasion in smaller family groups. The following is a quote from a pastoral letter of April 8, 1970 giving Mr. Armstrong's last official statement on this subject:

Mr. Herbert Armstrong had intended to write you all a note regarding how to conduct the "Night To Be Much Observed." However, with the financial crisis and many other things, he has been extremely busy and unable to. In fact, he is out of town today. So he told me to go ahead and tell you that he has now decided that there should not be <u>any</u> type of service or Bible Study on that evening with the new format we will now be using.

He said to simply tell the brethren to have two or three families eat and fellowship together on that evening in an attitude of thankfulness and rejoicing for the deliverance from sin which we as New Testament Christians experience. The host or leading man should ask God's blessing on the meal and the occasion but no further "sermonizing" will be necessary or helpful since the brethren will be meeting, for the most part, without an ordained minister present.

You ministers be sure to explain carefully the Sabbath before the meaning of this night of rejoicing and then tell the brethren to bear that in mind as the background and focus of the spiritual fellowship through that particular evening. But we feel it is better NOT to give them an outline of some kind of service...they will all get to hear from God's ministers twice on the very next day, the Holy Day, anyway. So, no Bible Study or sermonizing is necessary on the previous evening. It will merely be your responsibility to appoint elders and deacons to check with the brethren and be sure that the widows and other single people are included in the dinner and fellowship with one or more families so that no one is left out of the fine feast and fellowship on this night which pictures Israel's thankfulness and rejoicing in coming out of Egypt and our deliverance from sin.

Money Is Not the Root of All Evil!!

The plain truth about an old adage

MANY HAVE supposed the Bible says money is the root of all evil. It doesn't.

Money is a commodity—a medium of exchange for human convenience. It replaces the need to swap goods and services.

The thought that money, of itself, could be an evil reminds me of a boyhood experience. I was brought up in a respected church. Somehow I had the assumption the church believed that a pair of dice, a glass of wine, a cigarette or a theater was sin. Therefore we teenage boys stole away without parental knowledge on a Sunday afternoon to enjoy a matinee.

I suppose the motivation compared to that which caused people to buy a booklet on Hollywood newsstands some years ago titled How to Sin in Hollywood. The little book merely carried the names of restaurants and nightclubs.

Just what IS this thing called "sin"? I once asked a crusading evangelist if he would give me a biblical definition of the word. He couldn't—or wouldn't. But to satisfy curiosity you'll find the definition in I John 3:4, coupled with Romans 7:12, 14. Sin is a harmful way of life. It is transgression of an inexorable spiritual Law, as relentless as the law of

gravity. It is wrongdoing. The thing or the commodity is not evil, but the wrong use of it may be. The evil comes from evil motivations, intentions, attitudes and actions, it comes from what we call "the heart." It is spiritual, not materialistic, in principle.

Therefore, our troubles, sufferings and evils in the world are spiritual, not physical or materialistic, in nature.

That's why human accomplishments and achievements in the world are AWESOME, while at the same time we cannot solve our problems or eradicate the world's evils.

The basic spiritual Law—invisible, not understood, yet inexorable—is a way or LIPE! It is the way of outflowing love. Its violation is the way I term "GET" for brevity. This world has been living the way of "GET"—of coveting—of vanity and self-centeredness, but, toward others, of hostile competition leading to strife, violence and

war—of envy and jealousy, of resentment of authority. That incentive of mind and heart is spiritual in principle. It is the root cause of all the world's troubles, seemingly unsolvable problems and evils that beset us.

The basic invisible spiritual Law is outflowing LOVE—loving God from the heart and mind, and loving neighbor as self.

But what about MONEY? Money of itself is not evil. What the Bible does say about money is "the love of money is the root of all evil" (I Timothy 6:10). Money itself is a material commodity. It may be put to a very good use. It is the wrong motivation and attitude of mind and heart in relation to its use that may be evil.

Jesus did not decry money. Many of the great of the Bible were wealthy—Abraham, Joseph, Job, Joseph of Arimathea. Jesus did not disdain the rich because of money, but dined with them as well as with the poor. He called on all people to repent of transgressing the way of outflowing Lovatoward others. The test is the spiritual motive and attitude of mind and heart. They, not money of itself, are the root of all evil.

International News

Dutch Office Report February has been another month of blessings for God's Work here in the Netherlands. When we tested a newspaper flyer more than a year ago, the response was very low and costly. This month we inserted a flyer in The Telegraph, one of the largest newspapers in the Netherlands. We placed the flyer in a total of 105,000 Saturday editions in different parts of the country. We received a three percent response at a cost of \$3.50 per response. In addition to the flyer we placed ads in three other newspapers which resulted in a cost of \$2.50 per response.

The flyer and advertisement offer the reader a choice of receiving The PLAIN TRUTH in one of the five languages. They also contained a picture of Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong and front cover pictures of the PT's in the five languages. The international approach of the flyer and advertisement seems to appeal very well to the Dutch population, and so we intend to continue this format. As a result of this recent promotion the renewed readership of the Dutch PT stands at 19,500--an increase of 28% compared to February 1980.

Income for February shows a year-to-date increase of 34.87%. Church attendance increased 26.02% compared to one year ago, while the member-ship increased 8.6%.

News From Australia February was a month of excitement for God's Church in Australia as the tempo of the Work increased dramatically.

Final plans were laid this month for the commencement of television and radio broadcasting of Mr. Armstrong's latest programmes. Contracts have now been finalized with fifteen television and twenty-two radio stations throughout Australia to begin broadcasting next month.

Our newsstand programme was initiated with 15,000 copies of the newsstand edition of The PLAIN TRUTH distributed through outlets in Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide. By the end of February we had received a 1.9% response.

Plans for March included adding outlets in Brisbane, Bendigo, Hobart and Perth and increasing the number of copies distributed to 25,000, and to 50,000 in April.

We received 14,100 letters this month and mailed out 28,000 booklets and articles to interested readers of The PLAIN TRUTH. In addition, 12,000 copies of Mr. Armstrong's book, THE UNITED STATES AND BRITAIN IN PROPHECY, were sent out.

Mail income for February was an encouraging 29.9% increase over the same month last year, and our year-to-date income is 17.7% ahead of 1980.

ON THE WORLD SCENE

GROWING ALLIED DOUBTS ABOUT U.S. POWER POLITICS While Americans in general applaud the Reagan's administration's new show of strength in world affairs, the perspective is quite different among some U.S. allies. It is in one crucial area--the Middle East/Persian Gulf--that the greatest doubts persist about the new U.S. "act tough" posture.

Allied foreign policy planners in Europe are said to take the view that the United States could be more of a threat to Western vital interests in the oil-rich region than the Soviet Union. They are especially wary of Washington's desire to deploy forces in or near the Gulf to insure uninterrupted oil supplies. The United States has obtained permission to use and to upgrade facilities in Somalia, Kenya and Oman. The largest regional base of all will be a bit further out in the Indian ocean, on the British island of Diego Garcia.

Another particularly controversial proposal would have the U.S. station more than 1,000 peace-keeping troops in the buffer zone to be created in the eastern Sinai when the Israelis complete their withdrawal from Egyptian territory in April, 1982.

The growing fear in West Europe is that a more visible American presence could somehow "destabilize" the region. Worst yet, there is the fear that Washington might use its presence not for the intended purposes (to guarantee Egyptian-Israel peace in the Sinai plus keeping the Soviets at bay elsewhere) but might be tempted to intervene indiscriminately in local issues (such as on the side of the Saudi royal family if it is threatened).

The Sunday Telegraph's Peregrine Worsthorne (acclaimed as Britain's top journalist in 1980) notes that there is "sober doubt about American capacity to use conventional armed forces discriminately in an area about which they know little, without stirring up the sleeping dogs which might otherwise continue to be dormant."

Adding to doubt over U.S. wisdom is the cold fact of U.S. military defeats and blunders since the Korean War stalemate: the Bay of Pigs fiasco; the agonizing defeat in Vietnam; the failure of the rescue operation in Iran. These failures hardly inspire confidence. Adds Worsthorne: "Precisely because the stakes are so momentous, mistakes have to be avoided at all costs.... The Persian Gulf is a vital West European interest, incomparably more so than Cuba, say, or Vietnam. A Bay of Pigs type blunder there really would be the end of us. Yet this is the kind of American blunder which the West Europeans have good reason to fear in the Persian Gulf.

Of course, it would be well-intentioned, aimed at preserving Western civilization, etc. But then so was the American intervention in Vietnam.... The unwelcome truth is that few in Western Europe have any confidence in the American ability to undertake that kind of job without doing more harm than good."

The Americans, West Europeans feel, are totally naive to think that U.S. or Western allied armies could, in a mideast outbreak, sweep in and secure the oil fields and operate them without local support. This apparently is one of the key premises upon which the so-called "rapid deployment force" is based. Circles in West Europe believe such a concept is not only impractical, but if ever attempted, would lead to a ruin more swift and disastrous than an uncontested Soviet takeover of key Middle East oil suppliers.

Because of these growing doubts, there is a growing mood in West Europe to "accommodate" the Soviet Union in any threat from the latter to the Middle East, rather than relying on U.S. power and its uncertain consequences. It's not exactly the old "Better Red than dead" syndrome, Worsthorne observes, rather more one of "Better Red than bankrupt."

Worsthorne concludes his March 1, 1981 Sunday Telegraph analysis by saying: "Oil fear reaches parts that others don't, from where a <u>formidable</u> neutralist virus is beginning to spread."
