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MR. ARMSTRONG VISITS LAKE OF THE OZARKS

Everyone was surprised and delighted to learn of Mr. Armstrong's visit to the Lake of the Ozarks, as word began to spread on Friday, May 22. One minister, who was informed late Friday, found that three fourths of the congregation knew about it by Sabbath services the next day. This was indicative of the excitement generated by Mr. Armstrong's visit May 30th, when 3379 from 17 churches attended the combined meeting in our own building.

Initial planning was begun with a phone call from Mr. Tkach. Then the coordination of efforts came through Mr. Robert Fahey. The Lake of the Ozarks Church, with assistance from the Columbia Church, prepared the site.

We had had a great deal of rain the past few weeks here in the Ozarks. Sabbath morning the liquid sunshine was still falling and the cloud ceiling was low. The rain continued to fall heavily in the morning and lightly the rest of the day. The cloud ceiling lifted around noon, a short time before Mr. Armstrong's arrival.

Mr. Armstrong delivered a powerful message preparing God's people for the coming day of Pentecost. He emphasized the need to recognize what would have happened if Adam had taken of the tree of LIFE. "We need to think about this," he said. "Most of us have not spent sufficient time looking at this question," he emphasized.

Mr. Armstrong made very clear the fact that LIFE--real LIFE--was in Christ. Not the temporary, chemical life of man we normally think of, but inherent LIFE that is eternal. After explaining more about the mortal life of man, Mr. Armstrong gave special attention to the judgment that is on the Church, and how we have available God's Spirit which will lead to LIFE eternal. But we must first prove that we will obey God in this temporary life before we are given real LIFE!

He emphasized that Christ would build His Church and the gates of hell would not prevail against it (Matt. 16:18), and that the prophecies of the Old Testament were for the New Testament Church. It was a very timely and important message for the brethren gathered at this memorable occasion.

In the meeting with the ministers and wives, Mr. Armstrong explained that he delivers the overview, beginning in Genesis which, he emphasized, "I will continue to do." He admonished the men that "We must all speak the same thing. That which comes from Christ the head of the Church. Many forget that Christ is the head of the Church." Then as the ministers fill in the details to their congregations, he said they must always remember that Christ is the head of the Church. Christ works through human instruments and those instruments should deliver His message. Then they will all be speaking the same thing.

Mr. Armstrong then turned to some "lighter" topics which added to the enjoyment of the day.

It was the first time for several local church elders to hear Mr. Armstrong in person. They were very grateful for the opportunity to hear him in a ministerial meeting.

Though the sky was overcast it was still a bright day! For almost one third of the assembled members, it was their first time to see Mr. Armstrong in person. After services, hundreds expressed heartfelt appreciation for Mr. Armstrong's efforts in making these journeys to the outlying Church areas while continuing his heavy workload in Pasadena.

A very enjoyable and rewarding day!

FROM MINISTERIAL SERVICES

International News

Report From Manila, Philippines In the wake of flooding by torrential rains for more than the Noachian 40 days and 40 nights starting in December last year, a large portion of the southern island of Mindanao was totally devastated. A good number of the brethren in the area lost their crops and property. Thankfully, there was no toll on their lives. While the flood waters remained above rooftops for several days in many places, it was impossible for Regional Director Guy Ames to reach the affected members of God's Church until mid-March. Roads were washed out, and Mr. Ames had to travel through dangerously slippery mud by jeep and cross swollen rivers on a small native boat (banca) to get to the brethren in northern Davao and the Agusan provinces. They were found to be in high spirits.

Since the news of the Mindanao brethren's plight, members of several Luzon churches have sent money and used clothing to help rehabilitate them. A sizeable donation of money and used clothing has also been taken up by the Big Sandy Church in Texas, thanks to the efforts of Mr. Dale Shurter who visited Manila recently and relayed the news of the need to the Big Sandy brethren.

As if the earlier trial was not enough, a group of brethren later found themselves in the crossfire between government and rebel forces in northern Davao. Members were on their way to the morning Sabbath service in the newly established Nabunturan Church when the fighting took place. They were shaken but unhurt, and the start of services was delayed for awhile.

Two other incidents also closely brushed our brethren in the same area. Local elder Mario Dulguime reports on the situation:

Last April 1, brethren were witnesses to the divine protection of God. The mining site where they were panning gold was fired upon by the rebels, hitting a policeman and three CHDF (Civilian Home Defense Force) men. Stray bullets killed a woman and seriously injured another. Moments before one of the CHDF men was felled by a bullet, church member Geronimo Esparagosa was talking with him. Had it not been for the timely arrival of another member, Benito Pablo, who took hold of Esparagosa's hand and forced him to leave, he could have been hit too. Upon hearing the gunshot, the other brethren dived to the

ground and took cover among the huge boulders, while bullets rained upon them.

Another example of divine deliverance was Reynaldo Obligana. He almost became one of the 40 casualties when the cave where they were looking for gold collapsed. Moments before the accident, he was right there in the cave together with his 40 companions (not members). He was sent out on an errand by their team leader and had not yet gone far when he suddenly heard a big explosion that killed all his co-workers.

On the brighter side of the Work here, the first Filipino ministers to attend the Ministerial Refresher Program in Pasadena, Messrs. Edmond Macaraeg and Pete Melendez and their wives, have returned. They attended the ninth session in March.

While in Mindanao, Mr. Ames ordained the 32nd Filipino elder in God's Church in this area. He is Mr. Petronilo Leyson, who until then was a ministerial trainee. He is employed full time by the Work and will continue to serve in Butuan City as pastor of the church there.

In the last week of April Mr. Ames made his first visit to the churches in the Visayan islands. He spoke to the brethren in Cebu City and Tacloban City on two separate Sabbaths.

French Director Visits Quebec On Thursday, May 28th, Mr. Dibar Apartian, director of the French-speaking areas of God's Work, flew to Montreal. On Friday afternoon he addressed the French-speaking ministers, deacons and wives (27 people) and answered questions on the progress of God's Work around the world.

On the Sabbath, a record attendance of 534 brethren met in Montreal, coming from all French-speaking churches in the area. The same evening the first public Bible lecture was attended by 503 people, 125 of whom were new. Mr. Apartian discussed "The French Canadian Family--Today and Tomorrow."

The second lecture, held on Sunday afternoon, was attended by another 150 new people who heard Mr. Apartian speak on the future of Quebec. It was a most attentive audience and a good number of people stayed afterwards to ask questions.

On Sunday evening all the ministers and wives had a fine dinner and fellowship at the home of Mr. Picard.

Finances permitting, Mr. Apartian expressed the desire to see French-speaking ministers in Canada visiting the French Churches in Europe, and French-speaking European ministers preaching in Quebec. Time permitting, it is hoped that both Mr. Kneller, and Mr. Carion will be able to preach in Montreal on their way to or from the Refresher Program in Pasadena.

ON THE WORLD SCENE

MOSCOW'S ROLE IN FILLING THE EARTH WITH VIOLENCE It is for good reason that Jesus Christ singled out "wars and rumors of wars" as being one of the hallmarks of the end-time age. Wars there have been since time immemorial--but warfare in our day has taken on new and frightening dimensions. Much of the bloodshed is now caused by a worldwide terrorist network, with the spokes of the wheel leading back to Moscow.

Author Claire Sterling in her new book The Terror Network (excerpted in the May, 1981 Reader's Digest) divulges the terror lines emanating from Moscow through such countries and places as Libya, radical Palestinian factions, South Yemen, Cuba and KGB-staffed Soviet embassies, onto the various "national liberation fronts" and so-called "peace forces" around the world.

Soviet-inspired terrorism either foments or aggravates nearly every trouble spot in the world. And the aim everywhere is to tear down the power of the United States, Britain, the nation of Israel (Judah) and other Israelitish governments.

Just look at the three most intractable disputes in the world today--Northern Ireland, the Middle East and Southern Africa. Moscow's hand is in all three regions.

In Northern Ireland the fasting suicides of Bobby Sands and three associates have drawn enormous sympathy for the cause of the Provisional Irish Republican Army in strife-torn Ulster. The press in America, where so many people of Irish extraction live, is overwhelmingly pro-IRA and has been completely swayed by its propaganda. Little is said about how the small number of terrorists in the "Provos" wing of the IRA victimize their own Catholic countrymen in the six-county province. Nor are the linkups of the Provos to the worldwide terrorist network given much play.

In the Middle East, the fuse is still lit over the crisis in Lebanon. Israel has shown remarkable patience in not forcibly taking out the SAM-6 missiles the Syrians, under Russian prodding, moved in. Prime Minister Begin has let American and Saudi Arabian negotiators try to persuade Damascus to remove the missiles peacefully, so far without success. As the Israelis feared, the delay has worked to their disadvantage. The Soviets have shrewdly taken advantage of the situation in order to move more "advisors" into Lebanon to strengthen Syria's hand.

In South Africa, minor disruptions caused by the outlawed African National Congress (employing Communist-made weapons) damped the 20th anniversary "Republic Day" celebrations. And for the past few days coloured students near Johannesburg have rioted over the arrest of a student activist.

Civil rights groups in the United States are up in arms over documents leaked to the press (probably by a Carter Administration holdover in the State Department) which recommend closer U.S.-South African ties. The documents reportedly stress the importance that Washington attaches to "constructive internal change" in South Africa, but, even more importantly, voice U.S. concern for Soviet domination in the African subcontinent. This concern undoubtedly has been heightened by the announcement this week that Moscow will set up an embassy in Salisbury, Zimbabwe--formerly Rhodesia--certain to be staffed with oodles of KGB agents.

U.S. civil rights groups prefer not to see the geopolitical side of the story, however. Randall Robinson, director of TransAfrica, an anti-South African lobby in Washington, said that the documents "clear up any remaining shadow of a doubt that the United States is moving rapidly toward an open and obvious alliance with military dimensions with South Africa.

"I think it ought to be alarming to the American people," Robinson continued, "that this country is now clearly on a path toward this kind of relationship with perhaps the most vicious nation in the world since Nazi Germany." (It is common for activist groups to denounce Pretoria in hyper-exaggerated Hitlerian hysterics.)

A report financed by the liberal Rockefeller Foundation entitled "South Africa: Time Running Out," concludes that South Africa's racial policies "stir special concern because they could eventually lead to a race war that could have serious ramifications in the United States." It said if open conflict breaks out between white and black in South Africa--especially if the Communists should help wage a "war of liberation" against the white regime--the United States would face difficult questions and the resulting U.S. national debate "could quickly develop into divisive racial overtones, damaging to race relations in the United States."

Of course, this is exactly the type of disruptive impact that Moscow hopes would occur in America. This is where the Kremlin keeps funneling aid to "national liberation" camps around the world through its terror network.
