#### FROM MINISTERIAL SERVICES

News From Germany All the Churches here were excited over the 20,000 new PT subscribers resulting from our January flyer campaign in three major daily newspapers. Everyone is praying that our present subscriber list of 90,000 will yield new laborers to send into the harvest.

This month some 840,000 PLAIN TRUTH flyers were distributed by Germany's best known national daily newspapers. On January 19th, 280,000 flyers appeared in the SUDDEUTSCHE ZEITUNG, on the 20th 182,000 in DIE WELT, and on the 21st, 380,000 in the FRANKFURTER ALLGEMEINE ZEITUNG (FAZ). Just over two weeks later (5th of February) some 24,571 requests for The PLAIN TRUTH in one of the five languages have been received. In January a record breaking total of 19,692 new subscribers were added to the German-language file as a result of the advertising campaign.

The month of January proved to be an outstanding start for 1982. Although we had a good month for mail in January, 1981, the mail this year showed a 165% increase over last year.

Members closely followed Mr. Armstrong's trip to the Far East. His safety as well as his effectiveness in preaching the Gospel are obviously very high up on people's prayer lists.

Our lone member in Poland, Wiktor Przybylla, and his family are holding their own in the present crisis, according to reports from our brethren in East Germany. To keep the Przybyllas supplied with the many consumer items currently unavailable in Poland (including candles, matches, washing powder, canned meat, items of personal hygiene, etc.), the 12 German-language Churches alternate in sending "CARE Packages" to them every week.

French-language News Mr. Armstrong's television program began in Belgium over Tele-Luxembourg at 11:15 p.m. on January 1st. The amount of mail received following four of the successive programs is as follows:

First program: 96 letters Second program: 137 letters Third program: 60 letters

Fourth program: 76 letters (mail still coming in)

Mr. Apartian is currently on a visit to the Caribbean. His itinerary includes public Bible studies in Martinique and Guadeloupe with the possibility of an interview over Radio-Caraibes in Martinique.

We have just learned that our advertisement in the magazine PERSPECTIVES in Quebec has broken all records with a whopping 5,000 responses received. We also placed an advertisement in the magazine L'ACTUALITE from which 1,476 responses have been received so far.

Statistics ending December, 1981 show we had 7,634 new subscribers to La PURE VERITE added to our list in Canada (in addition to those above) and 11,695 for the remainder of the French-speaking world, giving us a grand total of 24,819. In addition, our ministers conducted 138 baptisms worldwide.

The good news from Publishing is that the newsstand program is still continuing to grow by leaps and bounds!

Through the diligent efforts of the pastors and their delegates in the field, the newsstand response rate is averaging three percent and more. With our present distribution, this is adding over 36,000 new readers to The PLAIN TRUTH every month.



# January Sets Brisk Pace for MPC

Last month the Mail Processing Center added 99,960 new people to The PLAIN TRUTH subscription list. This was the highest number of new people added in the first month of any year since the subscription list began in 1934. January is usually one of our lower months for adding new people. However, more people were added to the list this January alone than we had on the entire PLAIN TRUTH list until the late 50's! The number of new people added represented a 41% increase over January 1981.

Here is a graph showing the number of new people added to the subscription list during each month of January since 1970.



NEW PEOPLE ADDED (1,000s)

The three main sources of new people in January this year were PLAIN TRUTH home subscriptions, PLAIN TRUTH newsstands and television programs. These accounted for over 70% of the total.

# Examples of God's Protection

Recently we received the following letter from a member showing God's miraculous protection. We thought you would find the account inspiring and encouraging.

Dear Mr. Armstrong:

I sure do believe in guardian angels. I know God intervened and protected me many times while I was driving. I had some very close calls, and the miracles I have seen--there was no other answer....

On the way to the Feast, I stopped at a red light and a big truck hit me full force in the rear. The impact broke the truck's headlight and caused an oil leak. Glass was all over the rear end of my car. I got out and started to clean the glass off the rear lights--none of which were broken!...

The truck driver admitted that it was his fault as he wasn't paying attention. Another man came running over and asked if I needed a witness.... He said, "Lady, you have a mighty tough car!" I have a 1975 Plymouth Valiant. A lady from Church said God must have made the car rubber at the time of the accident--it had no damage at all!

Last winter, when I was coming home from my mother's place in a heavy snowfall, the car started to slide, then went over a bank and almost turned over. Then, all of a sudden, it went back on all four wheels. It was still running, and I continued on my way home with only a little grass on the bumper. #### ON THE WORLD SCENE

RUMBLINGS IN ASIA AS RUSSIA GOES FOR A "CHOKEHOLD" It is no mere happenstance that Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong has been led by Christ to step up activities of God's Work throughout Asia. Political events are beginning to move swiftly throughout that vast, populated region. Showdowns between major world powers are certain to occur.

Over the entire Western Pacific basin looms a growing, prowling Soviet military presence. The Japanese and others are very concerned over the rapid expansion of the U.S.S.R.'s Far East fleet, one that challenges the once preeminent U.S. Seventh fleet. "The Russian bear," as the saying goes, "now has webbed feet." The ships of Admiral Gorshkov's navy are ranging far and wide from their traditional home waters of the Sea of Japan into the warmer climes of the South China Sea and the Indian Ocean.

The fall of Vietnam was a great plus for the Soviets. Russian warships now regularly dock at the former giant U.S. base at Cam Ranh Bay. Soviet coastal patrol aircraft "monitor" heavy seaborne commerce in Southeast Asia from former U.S. air bases such as Da Nang.

The Chinese, for their part, are deeply concerned over Soviet expansionism in Asia. They are attempting to block further land conquests on the Indo-China peninsula made by the Soviet-backed forces of Vietnam. Says China's Vice-Chairman Deng Xiaoping: "The Soviets have a ready-made naval base at Cam Ranh Bay as well as scores of modern airfields, all provided by you Americans. If the Vietnamese, who we say are the Cubans of the Orient, succeed in Kampuchea [Cambodia], another base will be available to the Soviet Union in Sihanoukville [Kompong Som]. The Soviets actually started using these bases before the Vietnamese launched their aggression against Kampuchea."

But Chinese attempts to thwart Soviet ambitions, in turn, are not entirely welcomed by other nations in the region, such as those belonging to ASEAN—The Association of Southeast Asian Nations. ASEAN members are Singapore, Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia and the Philippines. The mainland Communist Chinese still have links, however subdued, to various Communist guerrilla groups which at times have threatened the stability of some of the smaller free Asian countries.

It's obvious that the only real power which can keep both the Soviets at bay and the Chinese in their place is the United States. But in the aftermath of Vietnam, U.S. power is no longer as credible as it once was.

The complex equation of Southeast Asia was recently discussed in an insightful interview with Singapore's Prime Minister, Lee Kwan Yew, published in the February 8, 1982 issue of U.S. NEWS AND WORLD REPORT. The 58-year-old Lee, Singapore's only Prime Minister to date, is known for his outspoken, clear-headed geopolitical views of world affairs.

When asked what role the U.S. should be playing today in Southeast Asia, Mr. Lee responded: "The U.S. must insure that the Soviet Union--either on her own or through her surrogate, Vietnam--should not be allowed to dominate or intimidate Southeast Asia with her military might. While China can be a counterweight to keep Soviet forces tied down on her eastern borders, the balance in Southeast Asia should not be complicated by bringing Chinese forces into the equation."

The Prime Minister then remarked that, in his view, the U.S. naval presence is too thin in the region; that instead of having one fleet for both the Western Pacific and Indian Ocean, there really should be a separate one for each. "You can't have Japan and your partners in Western Europe dependent for two-thirds of their oil upon the Persian Gulf and have your fleet in such a parlous [risky] state, now that the British have withdrawn from east of the Suez," he said.

The Soviets, noted Mr. Lee, have their eyes clearly set on those areas of the world, which if they could control them, would place the free world at their mercy. We have prophetically referred to these areas as sea gates. The Soviets call them "choke points." Prime Minister Lee, once again: "The Strait of Malacca between the Malay peninsula and the Indonesian island of Sumatra lends this area great strategic importance. The strait is one of

the five strategic choke points of the world, besides Gibraltar, Suez, Panama and the Cape of Good Hope. They must never become 'chokable' by the Soviets."

The CHRISTIAN SCIENCE MONITOR, in an article datelined from Malacca, Malaysia, on October 9, 1980 reported this concerning the vital Malacca sea gate area: "Over and over again Chinese spokesmen declare the Soviet Union must be blocked from its plans to seize control of the strait. If Vietnam backed by the Soviet Union consolidates control of Cambodia, they charge, the Soviet Union will be encouraged to construct a naval stranglehold on the oil-tanker clogged strait that connects the Indian Ocean with the South China Sea."

No one is more concerned about a Soviet chokehold on the Strait of Malacca than the Japanese. The passageway is the critical bottleneck on the oceanic "pipeline" that transports Middle East oil to their industries.

Japan, of course, is the giant machine that, as long as it keeps humming along, guarantees the prosperity of all of free Asia. Yet, because of the bitter memories of World War II, Japan's trading partners still want Japan to keep its distance too, at least militarily. As Prime Minister Lee puts it: "Economically, Japan is playing an important and constructive role in this region. The buoyant Japanese economy acts as a locomotive, pulling up the economies of the countries of Southeast Asia. Japan buys considerable quantities of raw materials and assembly-manufactured products from our region. We, of course, welcome that.

"A few countries in the region may be apprehensive that Japan may play too active a military role in Southeast Asian waters again. Their memories of World War II are still strong. So long as Japan confines herself to a naval role in the Western Pacific and the northern part of the China Sea and does not include Southeast Asia in her patrols, I see no cause for concern."

The key to Japan "keeping her place" is, once again, regional confidence in U.S. military power. Without it--look out! Concludes Singapore's Lee: "In the longer term, if the U.S. cannot maintain her world position as anchor man of the non-Communist world and cannot sustain Japan's confidence that America is a totally dependable ally when a grave threat appears, I fear Japan will go in for total self-defense, which must logically include nuclear weapons. That would not be in the interest of world peace and stability."

Sooner or later, a nuclear-armed Japan must appear on the scene, as loathe-some as that prospect would be to the vast majority of Japanese today.
