Church Tape Libraries

Some have misunderstood the recent instructions regarding tape recording at services, and in particular those instructions involving church tape libraries. Please go back and carefully reread both articles regarding tape recordings in the June 11, 1982 issue of the PGR.

It is permissible to have a local church tape library. It should contain only tapes of sermons or Bible studies given or played in the <u>local</u> congregation. Although individual members may not record services, they are free to check out tapes from the church library.

Members who check out tapes should not duplicate them or pass them around, but return them to the library by the due date. Pastors should look at the records periodically to be aware of who has checked out what. Pastors should also see that shut-ins and those who are ill have tapes of sermons or Bible studies that they missed made available to them.

Whether you have a local church tape library or not, an <u>official tape of</u> every service should be made and kept.

International News

German Office Following the Western Leaders' Summit Conference in Paris, France, Mr. Gene Hogberg, News Editor for The PLAIN TRUTH, came to Bonn to cover President Reagan's tour of West Germany. The Bonn office staff especially benefitted from the opportunity to talk with Mr. Hogberg during his five-day visit.

During June the world's largest printing exhibition, called DRUPA, took place in Dusseldorf. Mr. Roger Lippross of Fublishing Services arrived on June 10 and remained a week in order to keep abreast of the technical advancements in the printing and publishing fields.

Looking back on the first six months of 1982, we can recognize distinct positive trends in the Church and Work. Cur Lotal mail of 103,044 pieces thus far represents a 76% increase over the same period in 1981 (78,313 pieces of mail). So far this year regular mail is up 74%; donation mail is up 15%; media response mail (advertising response) stands at a plus 107%; and solicited mail has increased 52%.

The main contributing factor to our increasing mail is, of course, the rapidly growing circulation of the German-language edition of The PLAIN TRUTH, "KLAR & WAHR." Our June subscription list of 101,872 subscribers shows a 92% increase over 1981. Since January, 1982 we have added some 52,000 new subscribers, 15% of which (7,800) requested a language other than German.

<u>Philippines</u> Half a year has gone by, so it's time to prepare a semiannual report. The first six months of this year have been marked with continued growth in almost all areas of God's Work here. The following figures show the percentages of change over the first six months of 1981:

Exciting news from Publishing Services! We have been able to implement Mr. Armstrong's decision to expand the newsstand PLAIN TRUTH copy from 32 pages to 48 pages, beginning with the October/November combined issue.

A New Record Weekend in Mail Received

Mail Processing has just experienced the highest weekend for incoming mail in the Work's history! 54,589 letters and cards were received on July 17th and 18th. This outstanding mail volume is the result of Mr. Armstrong's semiannual letter to all subscribers. So far 72,604 people have sent their request for the books Mr. Armstrong advertised.

78% of TV Responses Are New Callers

Multiple thousands of people have called the Work's toll-free number to request literature offered on the telecast. In evaluating our records we find that 78% of these calls are from <u>brand new</u> people who are making their first contact with God's Work. The fact that so many new people are calling in is a very encouraging trend.

Mr. Armstrong's Sermon Tapes Inspire Members

ON THE WORLD SCENE

THE HOLY WAR ON THE EUPHRATES; MRS. THATCHER'S BIGGEST CHALLENGE

The hot wind of war is once again blowing across the desert wastelands at the head of the Persian Gulf. After finally ridding Iranian soil of Iraqi invaders who stormed in nearly two years ago, the legions of the Ayatollah Khomeini have mounted a long-expected counter-offensive into Iraq. The attack appears to have been blunted for the moment. But observers feel that the Ayatollah will not give up until he succeeds in installing his Islamic-fundamentalist, anti-West "new order" not only in Iraq, but throughout the entire Islamic world. Should that occur the fate of Western industrial civilization, still dependent upon Middle East oil, would be at his mercy!

Just what does the 82-year-old supreme leader of the Iranian revolution have in mind? Abbas Amirie, executive director of Iran's Institute for International Affairs from 1973 to 1979, wrote the following for the LOS ANGELES TIMES, July 18, 1982:

The original border dispute over the Shatt al Arab waterway [has] been overshadowed by a much larger goal now being pursued by the <u>Khomeini regime: expansion of the Islamic revolution throughout</u> <u>the gulf and, perhaps, the entire secular Arab world....</u> Khomeini's ultimate aim is fraught with such great peril that one cannot calculate its consequences....

Khomeini reiterated his vision on June 22, the eve of the holy month of Ramadan, telling a group of religious leaders: "When Tehran wins the war, the oppressed Iraqi people will join the Iranian people in installing an Islamic state in accordance with their wishes. And when our two nations unite, the smaller nations of the region will join us."

Khomeini and his fundamentalist supporters sincerely believe that most of the present political, education and economic systems of the Islamic countries are Western institutions imposed upon these states in order to exploit them and to destroy Islam, its vitality and value. They are convinced that if pro-Western regimes are replaced by Islamic government (their version) and the West's influence eliminated, Muslim societies, armed with Islamic laws and values, will unite and create a force and a civilization far superior to those of the West and the East. And so the Ayatollah Khomeini--and, for different reasons, his leftist supporters-are determined to eliminate the pro-Western governments of the region one by one...Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Qatar, Kuwait and the United Arab Emirates and Oman. The West must not allow this to happen.

TIME magazine featured the Ayatollah (TIME spells it "Ayatullah") on the cover of its July 26, 1982 issue, with the title "Iran on the March" and a subtitle comprising a quote from Khomeini: "This is a war between Islam and blasphemy." Here are the key excerpts of this article:

With the outbreak of fighting on Iragi territory, one of the most feared of Middle East scenarios was unfolding. The Arab world was already in disarray over Israel's invasion of Lebanon seven weeks ago...With no end to the siege of West Beirut in sight, another non-Arab country, Iran, had invaded Arab territory and seemed, moreover, to have a better-than-even chance of unseating the ruling government. At immediate risk were the moderate, hereditary regimes of Saudi Arabia and the rest of the gulf. But the Ayatullah Khomeini's vow was even more explosive: to press on to Jerusalem, to liberate the Holy City and overwhelm all enemies of Islam. Iran, notes the TIME report, is four times the size of Iraq and has a population that is three times as large. While active fighting has re-erupted along the Shatt al Arab, <u>Khomeini's forces are believed to be plotting the</u> <u>overthrow of every government in the gulf</u>. TIME learned that a new corps of revolutionaries is being trained under the name of <u>the Popular Front for</u> <u>the Liberation of the Gulf</u>. The group is led by an ayatollah operating out of Tehran. Recruits are said to be undergoing training in South Yemen and Libya and in a new facility recently opened for a class of 600 in northwestern Iran.

Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak is so concerned over Khomeini's radicalism that he is seriously considering a proposal to station several divisions of Egyptian soldiers along the borders of Iraq in Kuwait and in the eastern province of Saudi Arabia. In return, Egypt would insist on the restoration of diplomatic relations that were broken off by most of the gulf states following the conclusion of Egypt's peace treaty with Israel. Mubarak knows that such a scheme involves risks. Continues the TIME story:

Such a move not only might antagonize Egypt's generals, but would also anger the Islamic fundamentalists in the country. It was the fundamentalists who assassinated President Sadat last October, and they remain a threat in spite of Mubarak's crackdowns. Nonetheless, Mubarak is prepared to offer Egyptian troops to defend Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and the other gulf states, under the terms of the 30-year-old Joint Arab Defense Pact, if the arrangement is approved by the states involved and supported militarily by the U.S. Considering Mubarak's reluctance to send forces anywhere outside Egypt, the current discussion of such a mission is an <u>indication of how worried he is about the spread of</u> Islamic revolution.

Even some of Khomeini's friends are upset about the Iranian invasion of Iraq. The P.L.O., which has generally supported Khomeini out of deference to Syria, is furious with the Iranians for launching an invasion that can only divert attention from the Palestinians' plight in Lebanon...Not that such an argument would carry much weight with the ruler of Iran, which has once more become the primary power of the gulf. If the Palestinians want Jerusalem as the capital of a state of their own, Khomeini wants it as the goal of a holy crusade.

The same issue of TIME contained an interview with King Hussein of Jordan. In response to questions about the possible outcome of Iran-Iraq fighting, he said:

I really believe Iraq is very, very important to the future of the entire area. It is the route to Saudi Arabia, the gulf, to the heart of the region...This [Islamic fundamentalist] movement takes its direction from Tehran, and it is like a tidal wave. Eventually it will disappear. But what damage it can cause in this area! It could take many governments with it.

Mrs. Thatcher's Greatest Challenge

Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher's popularity among the British people continues at a high mark, the result of two remarkable victories, one

external, the other internal. The former refers, of course, to the successful conclusion of the Falklands war. The latter victory was achieved this week, when she forced railway unions to abort a nationwide rail strike. Mrs. Thatcher borrowed a page from President Reagan's text on throttling the nationwide air controller's strike in the U.S. by threatening to hire and train new train drivers to replace striking unionmen on the nationalized British Rail network. The strikers had been protesting BR's cost-cutting proposals regarding "flexible time" work schedules.

But now Mrs. Thatcher is facing her toughest challenge--how to crack down on IRA terrorists on the loose in England who were responsible for the incredible carnage produced by two bomb blasts set off in London on July 20, killing eight British soldiers, seven horses of the Queen's Household Calvalry and injuring at least 55 people. The Prime Minister labeled the back-to-back explosions a "callous and cowardly crime committed by evil and brutal men," adding, "We shall not rest until they are brought to justice."

Shortly before the IRA outburst, Mrs. Thatcher received an unusual accolade in the House of Commons from one of parliament's most colorful and certainly most eloquent MP's, Enoch Powell. His comments were reported in the TIMES of London a few days back (exact date not known):

Mr. Enoch Powell, it will be remembered, drew attention in his speech in the Falklands debate on that fateful April Saturday [April 3, the day after the Argentine invasion] to the fact that Mrs. Thatcher had rather rejoiced in the name once given her by the Soviet Union: the Iron Lady. And he added that in the weeks ahead we would see "of what metal she was made"....His words virtually pinned Mrs. Thatcher to the back of her seat, at the time. Defiantly she nodded agreement with him across the chamber, we remember....

Yesterday Mr. Powell rose during Prime Minister's question time. "Is the Right Hon. Lady aware that the report has now been received from the Public Analyst on a certain substance recently subjected to analysis? I have obtained a copy of the report. It shows that the substance under test consisted of ferrous matter of the highest quality...that it is of exceptional tensile strength, is highly resistant to wear and tear and to stress and may be used with advantage for all national purposes."

Mrs. Thatcher replied that she was grateful to Mr. Powell. "I agree with every word," she added.

The Prime Minister, and all others present, knew what Mr. Powell primarily had in mind with his phrase "all national purposes": the so-called "troubles" in Ulster. (Mr. Powell, though he is an Englishman, has been the Unionist MP from Down South in Northern Ireland since October, 1974.)

Unique Statesman

Incidentally, the oft-maligned and generally misunderstood Mr. Powell has just passed his 70th birthday. The TIMES ran nearly a full page in its June 14th edition detailing his rather remarkable career in public service. The TIMES profile put to rest once and for all charges that Mr. Powell is a "racist." (He got into political hot water in April, 1968 for a speech before an obscure audience in which he warned of future problems over nonwhite immigration into Britain from the Commonwealth, a warning partly confirmed by eruptions of racial disorders in Britain last summer. He was summarily fired from the Tory "shadow cabinet." Yet, before that speech he had passionately decried ill treatment of Mau Mau prisoners in Kenya.)

Few MP's in Parliament can match Enoch Powell's academic credentials. Before the second world war he was a professor of Greek at Sydney University in Australia, and has authored books on ancient Greek historians. He speaks French, German, Italian, Urdu and knows Sanskrit. His current literary effort is an historical reexamination of the New Testament which, according to the TIMES profile, "will certainly light a fire under biblical and theological scholarship."

A patriot <u>par excellence</u>, Mr. Powell has always been a staunch defender of British royalty. The TIMES article quotes part of a remarkable speech which Powell gave on April 22, 1964 before the Royal Society of St. George. He said at that time: "We on our day ought well to guard, as highly to honour, the parent stem of England, and its royal talisman; for <u>we know not</u> what branches yet that wonderful tree will have the power to put forth." Quite prophetic, though I'm sure Mr. Powell didn't intend it that way. Check Jeremiah 23:5 and 33:15 as well as Isaiah 11:1 about "a righteous Branch" yet to stem from that "wonderful tree" as Mr. Powell calls it.

The TIMES writer, immediately after quoting from the 1964 speech, commented very appropriately:

I ask, simply, on his seventieth birthday, has there been any Western politician since 1945, save Churchill and de Gaulle, who would, or could, dare speak in tones of such grandeur, simplicity, and decency? We are all familiar with Tories who trumpet Churchill, and Labour politicians who intone past injustice. But, who has that capacity, whether you judge him right or wrong?

I thought our readers might enjoy this insight into a rather remarkable public figure, one who unfortunately was forced into political background in 1968.
