Let's have reasons, for or against, that are rational and that make sense!


First, look at today's teenage world. Realize how it has changed!

# Are today's teens really worse?

There are those who, in their self-confident uninformed optimism, assure us that today's adolescents are no different—and certainly no worse—than those of past generations. But the facts prove otherwise.

Human nature is the same. But we simply live in a different world today. The emergence of the phonograph, the automobile, the motion picture, radio and television and other productions

of the machine age have brought new influences and changing customs. Human nature, adapting to changing times, expresses itself very differently today.

Some would hush up the naked FACTS. But the welfare of today's youth is at stake. Adolescents, drifting with the immorality tide, are speeding past their elders in

the downward plunge. There is a trend. It is an immoral trend. It is speeding up at accelerated pace. It is only natural for young people to follow the trend. They want to belong. It's time to face the facts

squarely.

People are like sheep. They all follow the leader to the slaughter. But they don't know they are being led to the slaughter. They are just a little stupid. Yes, quite a little! But they still want to belong! It's natural to just go with the group.

### From chaperons to "loving up"

Look how times have changed — and moral standards with them!

When my mother was of dating age, in the middle 1880s, chaperons were in vogue. She wore

long sleeves, high necks and skirts that dragged in the dust. When a young man began dating a young lady it was called "courting."

A generation later, when I arrived at adolescence, the chaperons had disappeared. But in the earlier years of dating—after age 16—caressing, today called "necking," was not yet the general practice. Or if it was, I must have been highly ignorant.

I distinctly remember one incident — after I had passed 20.

A date should be an event that adds to the mental, social, moral and spiritual character development of both boy and girl.

A girl I frequently dated and I were being driven to her home by a young man with his girl friend. In those days all cars were completely air-conditioned they were open cars. It began to rain. We buttoned on the sidecurtains.

To hold the curtain down, on my girl friend's side, I was obliged to stretch my arm over the seat behind her. I shall never forget the difficulty I experienced in keeping my arm far enough to the rear to avoid any contact with the back of her neck. I was terribly afraid she would think I was "fresh" if any part of my arm touched her!

Today's bold young people will get a real laugh at this. Yes, indeed - TIMES HAVE CHANGED!

Later I knew of an experience involving a young man about 21 whom I knew very well. He and a 21-year-old chum were doubledating two girl chums. The other couple had begun "loving up" as the younger generation then termed it. So this friend of mine began to fear he would be considered "slow," or behind the times. "Loving up" was then beginning to be considered the thing to do, after the first two or three dates. So this fellow began cautiously putting his arm around this girl's shoulder. She didn't shove it back. A date or two later, he worked up enough courage to kiss her. She made no objection. He remained very proper, otherwise.

The girl's father was dead, and her stepfather was a dealer in Buick automobiles. He and his wife often took the young couple out on Sunday afternoon rides.

Very few families owned automobiles in those days. The young people sat in the backseat, and his arm usually was around the girl's shoulders. There was no objection from her mother or stepfather. It seemed to be accepted as normal.

One night, sitting in a frontporch swinging seat, the girl began to tell this young man how much money her father had left her. It was not a fortune, but a few thousand dollars. She began suggesting what they might do with it.

"Wait a minute!" he suddenly exclaimed. "Just what are you getting at?"

"Why," she replied, "I thought we ought to begin to plan what we will do after we are married."

"Married!" he exclaimed, in sudden alarm. "Who said anything about getting married?"

"Why," she came back, equally surprised, "what have you been loving me up for, if we're not going to be married?"

The flabbergasted young man then explained that he had never indulged in "loving up" before, but had begun to feel out-of-date, supposing it was expected. The girl burst into tears, jumped up and ran into the house, slamming the door behind her. Next day the boy tried to contact her by telephone. Her mother answered the telephone.

"Lucille told me all about it," said the indignant mother, icily. "She never wants to see you again." And she never did!

But in those "loving-up" days, prior to World War I, girls were kept "decent." Actual sexual intercourse was "unthinkable." The girl who did submit to it "lost her honor."

Have times changed?

The question sounds ridiculous today. Full premarital coitus is the rule — except the word premarital is a little out of date. Even marriage is on the way out.

### The teen influence

Few people stop to realize to what extent teenagers have taken over. They pretty well dominate the world picture.

Isaiah foretold this day. Here is a portion of the prophecy: Speaking of our people — TODAY — in these very last days — God says: "And I will make boys their princes [Moffatt translates it, "I will make mere lads their leaders"], and babes shall rule over them ... the youth will be insolent to the elder, and the base fellow to the honorable... My people — children are their oppressors . . . the daughters of Zion are haughty . . . " (Isaiah 3:4-5, 12, 16, Revised Standard Version) — continue with Moffatt: "... holding their heads high as they walk, and ogling with their eyes, walking with their mincing steps . . . " (verse 16). And this latter expression, about ogling eyes, when properly translated, actually refers to painted eyes — makeup on the face, and sensuous manner of walking to arouse boys.

Now look at the facts!

Who determines what is popular music today? The teens. Adolescents determine dancing trends, motion-picture themes, radio formats and even advertisements and most fields of entertainment!

What many do not realize is that this teenage influence on the whole society is predominantly sexual influence. There is much more intense preoccupation with sex during these years than in later maturity.

Therefore SEX became the basic formula for motion pictures — along with violence and crime, including murder.

Teenage morality and respect for decency have plunged to an all-time low. Many youths express the attitude that there is nothing wrong with illicit or promiscuous sex.

And WHY?

Take one typical example. A 19-year-old boy had been in a certain town only six months. He named to police 11 girls with whom he had engaged in illicit sex. Many from "the best" families. "You can 'make' almost

# Are You AHEAD of Your Time?

You can be ahead of the game!

s unbelievable as it sounds, William Thompson started college when he was 10½ years old!

Jay Luo was only 12 when he received his bachelor of science degree in mathematics, and Dr. Merrill Wolf attained a bachelor of arts degree in music from Yale University at 14.

These men, whose accomplishments are listed in the Guinness Book of World Records, began or even finished college long before most people graduate from high school.

When it came to academics, at least, these men were far ahead of their time.

Being ahead of one's time is equally rare in other facets of life. Consider, for a moment, the career, family, emotional and spiritual aspects of life. Most people are not really in control of these parts of their lives. They just float with the current and remain average.

To really be in control of your life in these areas, you've got to be ahead of your time — to plan and do the things others just let happen to them.

## Don't let life just happen

This world is full of billions of

people who let life happen. Of course, there are notable exceptions, but far too many people daydream away their youth, blunder through their ho-hum middle

age and worry away their old age with boredom and questions about God and the meaning of life.

But, happily, this tragedy doesn't have to happen to you. The good news is that, while it may take a superior intellectual power to enter college at the age of 10, it does not take a genius to be far ahead of your time in the most important things in life.

It does take planning and effort, however. You have to approach life with right goals, values and priorities.

The Bible gives an encouraging example of one young person who did have the right values, and did lead a planned life, at least in the most important areas, even when he was young. His name was David.

Now, David did not start college when he was 10 years old, but he was a thinking young man

who put great effort into the important things in life. While he was young, he built a firm foundation for his life and was ready to face problems far beyond his years.

### Facing giant problems

What would you do if you faced ferocious wild animals or a giant who blasphemed God and wanted to kill you? David faced these situations and showed how much ahead of his time he was by overcoming the obstacles in each case.

How did he do it? The statement he made before facing the Philistine giant, Goliath, shows his answer: "The Lord, who delivered me from the paw of the lion and from the paw of the bear, He will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine'" (I Samuel 17:37).

You see, David did not wait until he was old before wondering



why he was born, and proving whether God exists. He set important spiritual priorities as a teen that many people leave for What would you do if you faced ferocious wild animals or a giant who blasphemed God and wanted to kill you?

later in life, or don't get around to at all.

The story of David is an exciting one. One article is too short to tell of all the exploits David did, but you can read them yourself beginning in I Samuel 16.

Read how David killed Goliath and became a champion of his people. Read how he honored his king even though the king was trying to kill him. And, yes, even read of some of the personal tragedies that he brought on himself (not even David was ahead of his time in everything). Yet, overall, he handled his life so well that God Himself called him "a man after My own heart" (Acts 13:22).

Why did David succeed with God and man, and become a king when others around him remained average? Simply because David took life seriously, even at an early age.

Not too seriously, of course. David had fun and developed his musical and athletic skills. He had close friends. He enjoyed life. But, as a teen, he realized that to succeed in life he had to begin to plan, work and seek God then, not later when he was 18, 25 or 75.

### Beyond our wildest dreams

At times life can be discouraging. You or I might look to the few supertalented people who finish college at 14. And we might begin to feel life is hopeless for those of us with only average ability.

But the truth is that, if we make up our minds to be ahead of our time, God has given us ability enough to succeed in life beyond our wildest dreams.

But it requires that we, even while we are young, approach the important things of life head-on in a serious, well-planned manner.

The most important area we need to think about and work on is our spiritual life. A teenager is not too young to begin to make important spiritual changes in his or her life.

You can take the principles

you've learned from this magazine, from your parents and from reading the Bible, and begin to apply them in your life now.

Spending time in personal prayer every day is not something that should be put off until a person is an adult, either. David did those things in his youth, and so can we.

## Other goals

If you have been negligent about planning for college or a career or learning a skill, you can now begin to take this problem seriously and do something about your future.

And, if you have been ignoring personality or character development, you can now begin to take these areas of life more seriously (while not neglecting time to have good, plain fun!).


If you do these things, you will be one of the few young people around who have followed the advice of wise King Solomon, who said:

"Rejoice, O young man, in your youth, and let your heart cheer you in the days of your youth; walk in the ways of your heart, and in the sight of your eyes; but know that for all these God will bring you into judgment. Therefore remove sorrow from your heart, and put away evil from your flesh, for childhood and youth are vanity [fleeting].


"Remember now your Creator in the days of your youth, before the difficult days come, and the years draw near when you say [perhaps because of ill health, depression or loneliness], 'I have no pleasure in them'" (Ecclesiastes 11:9-10, 12:1).


long distances or wait in long lines (or queues) — you can talk to Him at your convenience!

# Here Come the Supertrains!

• In France, they're called TGVs. The Japanese call them shinkansen. In Britain, they're called APTs. But wherever you are, you'll call them fast.

They are high-speed trains, designed to carry passengers quickly from city to city. They could be zipping into your area before long.

The shinkansen, Japanese for "bullet trains," have been running in Japan since 1964. In their 20 years of operation, the 120-mile-an-hour (193 kilometer)

120-mile-an-hour (193 kilometer) trains have carried more than two billion\* passengers. The Japanese instantly fell in love with the shinkansen.

But other countries weren't so quickly smitten. It took a while, but bullet trains are now being built in other countries.

In 1981, France began operating its *Train a Grande*Vitesse (High-speed Train). This train can hustle people along at

162 miles (260 kilometers) an hour. The French plan to build a network that eventually will serve most of the country.

The United Kingdom, too, has been building a train system, the Advanced Passenger Train, or APT, that will speed people from London to Glasgow at about 125 miles (200 kilometers) an hour.

Other countries are getting on the high-speed train track as well. West Germany and Canada are working on high-speed train systems for their countries. In the United States, plans have begun on a high-speed train in California.

Even bigger plans than these are in the works. The Japanese have pioneered an entirely new kind of train that zips along at more than 300 miles (480 kilometers) an hour — never touching its tracks. The trains — scientists call them magnetic levitation vehicles — work on the same principle that makes

magnets either cling to or repel each other.

In the new system, the track bottoms are lined with magnets that have the same polarity as magnets inside the trains. The two sets of magnets repel each other, lifting the train above the track. Another set of magnets is used to pull the train forward along the track.

In theory, this type of train would be able to go 1,500 miles (2,400 kilometers) an hour.

Underground magnetic trains are on the drawing board that could travel 14,000 miles (22,500 kilometers) an hour, 19 times the speed of sound. New York to Los Angeles in 11 minutes? — By Lowell Wagner Jr.

# The Longest Olympic Relay

 On July 28, a lone runner will enter the Los Angeles, Calif., Coliseum to the cheers of nearly 100,000 spectators gathered for the 1984 Summer Olympics.

Raised in the runner's arm will be the Olympic torch that will light the Olympic flame to officially start the Summer Games.

The arrival of the torch in Los Angeles will be the end of an incredible journey spanning three months and covering thousands of miles.

This journey begins in Olympia, Greece, site of the original Olympics in the 700s B.C. From Olympia, it will be carried to Athens by Greek athletes. From there, it will be flown to New York City, arriving in early May.

From New York, runners will carry the torch on a zigzag path through most of the 50 states in the United States.

Each runner will carry the torch for one kilometer (six-tenths mile) and light the torch of the next person in line. Participants get to keep their torch and also receive a uniform identical to the one worn by the last runner in this giant relay.

Carrying it together for the first kilometer will be the grandson of Jim Thorpe and the granddaughter of Jesse Owens.

Mr. Thorpe was the 1912 decathlon champion. Mr. Owens won four gold medals in the 1936 Olympics.

In addition to the main team of runners, a special support team

will be used to keep the torch moving 24 hours a day on its journey through the United States. The support team will relay the torch through sparsely populated areas like Death Valley and the Rocky Mountains, where volunteers for the main team will be harder to find.

The reason for this mammoth

relay? Its organizers hope to raise millions of dollars by charging runners or their sponsors \$3,000 each to take part.

The money will be given to several youth organizations to finance youth sports programs teaching young people more about Olympic events. — By Ed Stonick

The Afghanistan Behind the Headlines


 You've probably heard about Afghanistan in the news the last couple of years, and most of what you've heard has probably been about war.

Continued violence among opposing groups within the country, along with military action there by the Soviet Union, has left Afghanistan a war-torn country. But behind the headlines, there is a nation whose peoples take pride in their homeland and their heritage.

Afghanistan is a landlocked country in southwest Asia. It is first mentioned in history in the sixth century B.C., when it was first conquered by the Persians. Then, 200 years later, the region was dominated by Alexander the Great.

Arabs conquered the region in the middle of the A.D. 600s, introducing Islam as the country's dominant religion. Over the centuries, many tribal rulers and foreign leaders tried to take control of Afghanistan. By the 1700s, the native Afghans formed a unified kingdom.

In the 1800s, Britain and Russia tried to exert their influence over Afghanistan. In 1919, Afghanistan was recognized as an independent nation. Since a 1979 military intervention, though, the Soviet Union has dominated the country's

government.

Afghanistan is a mountainous country, with some peaks in its Hindu Kush range soaring as high as 25,000 feet (7,620 meters). The high altitudes have a major effect on the climate.

Temperatures often fluctuate wildly from dawn to afternoon. In Kabul, the capital, the highest July temperature on record was 97 degrees Fahrenheit (36 Celsius). The lowest July temperature ever was 2

perature ever was 24 below zero Fahrenheit (-31 Celsius).

Besides mountains,
Afghanistan has areas covered
with vast deserts and fertile
farming valleys. It is these valleys
that make Afghanistan mainly an
agricultural country, although
there is some mining and textile
manufacturing.

The country's rugged terrain makes travel a problem. Violent spring floods often wash out the

roads, mainly unpaved. There are no railroads, and its rivers are too narrow and fast-flowing for ships.

The population is about 18 million, living mostly in rural areas of the country's 28 provinces. Only about 10 percent


of the people live in towns of 3,000 or more.

Afghanistan has been a crossroads of Asia, which accounts for the ethnic variety found among the people. Most of the people make

their living as farmers in the river valleys or as nomads traveling the country in search of grazing land for their animals.

Just as Afghanistan is a land of many peoples, it is also a land of many languages. Pashto and Dari are the two official languages. Pashto is spoken by about half of the population, Dari by about a third. Many other languages are spoken in parts of the country.

Afghan cultural life is characterized by traditional arts and pastimes, one of which — telling stories — has been preserved over the centuries, passing on the culture and history of this ancient land from generation to generation. — By Tom Delamater



 At least one third of all U.S. high school and college age women take nonprescription diet pills in an effort to lose weight, according to two university

ccording to two universi studies.

A study at the University of Michigan found that four

out of 10 high school senior girls have used diet pills. In a second survey, Michigan State found that, in a group of 944 students, 30 percent of the women and 4 percent of the men had used them.

Dr. Lloyd Johnston, director of a study carried out by the University of Michigan's Institute for Social Research, said: "Frankly, we were a little shocked by what we found. I certainly hope these drugs are safe . . . because a substantial proportion of America's young women are using them in their formative years."

Ironically, 68 percent of the Michigan State students felt the pills had only a limited weight-loss effect in the long run.

There is some doubt that the drugs are entirely safe. One of the chemicals used in many diet pills, called PPA, has drawn the sharpest criticism. Dr. Arthur Vener, who worked on a study conducted by Michigan State University, says that studies on the chemical reveal "an enormous amount of side effects. One of the most life-threatening is hypertension [high blood pressure]. PPA may raise the blood pressure to the point where it can become a serious problem."


This disease, which usually doesn't affect young people, can have a drastic impact on a person's health.

Dr. Laurence Krupka, who worked on the Michigan State study, sounds a different kind of warning. "Too many people rely too heavily on pills to [help them lose weight]. They need to understand that they either have to reduce their calorie intake or utilize more energy to lose weight and not rely on diet pills."

# Do Your Parents Understand You?

My teen years were full of trauma. And, to make it worse, my dad couldn't understand what I was going through. Or so I thought.

Some things you wish you could forget.

I can well remember my teen years. All too well! There never was a time when I wasn't going through a traumatic experience.

It might have been easier if my dad had understood all the difficulties and agonies I was going through. But how could he have? He didn't seem to feel things the way I did — things that bothered me didn't seem to matter to him much.

Not that I thought a lot about what he thought. I had enough other things to worry about.

### The smallest in the class

The time when I was 13 seems

only yesterday — I was the smallest in our class at school. Oh, the agonies, when even all the girls towered above me! Especially at the school dance when there were few girls who would dance with me. (Who wants to dance with a guy shorter than you anyway!)

At the age of 14 I hadn't grown much more, but to top it all off I

developed pimples. It would have been all right if I had started shaving — at least then I would have had something to brag about. But I had another four years to go!

However, around the age of 15 things began to improve. I began to grow! At one time I remember growing 1½ inches in two months.

But the excitement didn't last long. I grew upward, but didn't put on any weight. I was so thin I could have probably hidden behind my own shadow. I was like a bean pole.

Things seemed to go from bad to worse. At the same time I

started to grow, I'm afraid my mouth did as well. I would always say the wrong thing at the wrong time. You think of all the cliches and they applied to me! I put my foot in my mouth so many times I suffered from an extreme case of athlete's mouth.

In my insecure world I would try to cover up my mistakes by trying to do one of two things. One was to try and talk my way out of it — at which I didn't succeed. All I ever did was to dig myself further into a deeper hole and confirm all the suspicions everyone had of me.

Or else I would try to be funny in some idiotic sort of way and try to make them forget what I had done. Once again, instead of taking their minds off what I had done, it just made me look like an even greater fool.

Somehow I survived those years. During that time I was not aware of how many difficulties my four sisters and my brother were going through — I was too worried about my own.

And, of course, my father never understood me. He couldn't

understand the agonies I was going through. Or so I thought!

### Understanding Dad

Dad's mother died when he was 18 months old. As a boy he had to do the cooking for his father and two older brothers while they worked on the farm. He was 18 when world war broke out and was soon off to Europe to fight in France.

Dad didn't talk much about the time he spent in the trenches. I do know his feet nearly rotted off because of all the

mud and slush they were in — day after day, month after month.

I know his poor hearing

resulted from the constant pounding of the guns. He didn't tell us much about that part of his life, but I have read enough about it to hope and pray I don't have to go through anything like that.

My father had been through a lot. Now, when I stop and think about it, I realize that he knew much of what I was going through. Part of the reason he didn't show his feelings is that they'd been hurt so often he had learned to keep them inside himself.

He may not have been able to express himself the way he would have liked — but it was a two-way street. I was too tied up in my own little world to recognize his attempts to help. Understanding was there before me, but I couldn't see it.

### Give them a chance

Your parents understand what you're going through far more than you may realize. The chances are they see you experiencing some of the same emotional traumas they did when they were teens.

Why not ask them? Find out what were some of their most embarrassing moments, how they felt at their first dance, what troubled them the most in high school. What were their greatest joys, pains, fears?

Give your parents a chance to help. Sometimes just sitting down and talking over the problem makes it much easier. It will bring you all closer together, and the chances are, once you have shared your feelings, the problem won't seem so great.

Opening up to your parents can be a big step for you. If you have any difficulty in communicating, follow a lesson I learned some time ago. If you don't know how to say something, "just say it." Once you get started, it's not that bad — and your mom and dad are probably far more understanding than you ever figured. And they may have difficulty expressing themselves, too, so try to be understanding in return.

Try it — it can bring remarkable results! □

he other day the telephone rang. "Did you send me a bouquet of flowers?" a friend asked excitedly. "I received it this morning, but it wasn't signed. I wish I knew whom to thank!"

We had not sent the flowers. It seems the sender wished to remain anonymous. Yet the flowers conveyed a message, even without a signature. Just by being sent, the flowers said, "Someone cares," for flowers have a language all their own. It is universal. It breaks language barriers. It crosses continents.

Do you know their language?

#### A silent celebration

Flowers play a significant part in our daily lives. Look around your home. You may be surprised how many floral patterns you can see.

We decorate our walls with floral paper or

paintings of flowers. Girls wear dresses with floral prints and put flowers in their hair. Flowers made of icing are part of the decoration on wedding cakes. myriad shapes and sizes. Flowers grow wild around us, too, in every part of the world. They form an essential part of the complex web of nature. They even signal the seasons.

Some wild flowers, like the tiny white snowdrops in Europe, grow as winter ends. Snowdrops are also known as February fair maid. Flowers like snowdrops reassure us that the cold weather will end, and some winters we need reminding!

Other flowers celebrate spring and summer. They spice our countryside with color. One week they're not there, or are just peeping out of the ground as a hint of small leaves. Then, suddenly, the fields, the meadows, the stream banks and the hedgerows are brilliant in different hues and fragrant with various scents.

With a little rain, flowers such as evening primroses can bloom even in an arid desert. Their seeds lie dormant in hard ground during dry weather. However, should a little water fall to the ground, the arid desert truly blossoms as a rose.

It's as though flowers the world over are saying thank-you to their Creator for their existence — for being a small part of the cycle of life.

### Flowers through the ages

Throughout history, flowers and plants have been linked with man. Perhaps the most well-known flower of all ages is the queen of flowers — the rose.

This celebrated flower is found today in most parts of the world. Some of the many cultivated varieties of roses originated in places such as Persia (Iran), Greece, North America and China.

The link between roses and man covers thousands of years. In ancient Rome, for example, roses were extremely popular. Roses adorned the victorious chariots of armies and were put on graves.

They were also used at feasts. Emperor Nero was said to have had large numbers of roses rain down on his state dining room, overpowering his guests with their scent!


Roses symbolize perfection, beauty, mystery and peace. One of the many cultivated varieties is even named peace, although a war — the War of the Roses in late 15th century Tudor England — was also named after the flowers.

Today a rose is a national emblem of England. In the United States, too, it is the adopted flower of several states, including Iowa, which claims the wild rose as its flower.

### Different uses

Besides their purely aesthetic beauty, flowers have been valued for many other uses. Some flowers in different countries even tell the weather. The





European scarlet pimpernel, for example, closes when it's going to rain. This flower is also known as the "poor man's weatherglass."

Wild rose petals are among the most versatile. They can be used in wine, tea and vinegar. Rose petals can be used in foods, too, such as jam, Turkish delight sweets and jelly. Their fragrance improves many dishes, in addition to their use as a perfume. There are even rose petal sandwiches served as a delicacy at teatime.

Besides these exotic foods, of course, flowers also give us the major food crops, such as rice and wheat. And the meat we eat comes from animals that feed on the plants.

Some plants are also essential for our basic needs like clothing. Flax, for instance, is used to make linen, while the fiber from the cotton plant is used to make cotton cloth.

Paper is another vital substance made from the wood stem of plants. Wood itself is needed to make



houses and furniture, while coal, the fossilized remains of plants, is an important fuel today.

As we have seen, plants have been vital to man from earliest history. Without plants man could not exist! They generate oxygen for the air that we breathe.

These are just some of the uses of flowers and plants. Flowers are incredibly useful and beautiful creations!

They still have an aura of mystery for man today, just as they have since ancient times. They play a vital role in the cycle of nature, both in their life and in their death. They're temporary and they remind us we are too.

### Sending floral messages



magine a chess set with life-size pieces.

Imagine the pieces made out of clay, and painted to look like real life. Imagine them 2,000 years old, with Chinese faces, no two of them identical. And, instead of imagining 32 pieces, imagine about 7,500.

Got it? Good. You've just imagined something like what has been discovered in the central part of China — not exactly a chess set, but 7,500 statues of warriors and horses — a life-size army formed about 210 B.C.

Chinese farmers near the Wei River first discovered this ceramic army in 1974 when they were digging a well. Although some of the statues were found whole, the majority were in pieces.

Most of the statues were found in one large pit, which contained foot soldiers, horses and charioteers arranged in orderly rows. A nearby, smaller pit contained crossbowmen and charioteers, while a third pit seemed to contain most of the officers — a sort of command center.

Archaeologists — scientists who dig up and study objects from the past — believe that the



individual body parts for the pottery soldiers were first shaped in a mold, and then joined together into complete figures by clay coils. Many fine details of the soldiers' armor, buttons, facial features and even the tread on the bottom of their shoes were then added. After being heated to harden the clay, the figures were painted and equipped with real weapons.

But, you might be thinking, why would anyone bury an army of life-size toy soldiers and horses? To find out, we need to catch a glimpse into China's history.

Chinese archaeologists and historians believe that the clay army was placed in its pits to guard the tomb of China's first emperor, Qin (pronounced chin) Shihuang\*, which stands less than a mile (about 11/4 kilometers) away. The tomb lies beneath a large mound, still unexcavated. When Qin Shihuang was born in 259 B.C., China was

not the great, unified

nation she was to become. Instead, China was divided into several smaller states, with much the same language and culture, but constantly warring against each other.

Feudalism — in which the people owe loyalty to a landlord, rather than a national government was the social and economic system. Little progress or prosperity could exist, for most of the governments were primarily concerned with enlarging their borders and defending them against enemies. The time was right for a strong leader to emerge.

And that is exactly what happened. In 246 B.C. Qin Shihuang, just 13 years old, became ruler of Qin, a western state that was relatively strong because it had managed to avoid much of the destructive fighting. By the time he was 25, Qin Shihuang had conquered most of China and proclaimed himself

First Emperor.

In China's long history, Qin Shihuang stands as a giant figure. He standardized the system of weights and measures throughout the empire. He built the world's longest fortification, the Great Wall of China, by connecting and improving the smaller walls the warring states had built to keep out barbarian tribes. He also

instituted a great program of road building throughout the empire. He even standardized the lengths of axles on wagons and chariots, so that all these vehicles could travel in the same ruts.

Along with these achievements, however, Qin Shihuang is remembered for his ruthlessness. He forced hundreds of thousands of men to build the Great Wall and elaborate palaces for himself. He drained the wealth of the country, adding to his personal glory and riches. And he had most of the books in China burned, and many scholars buried alive! The reason for this was that much of the learning in China at that time centered around Confucianism, a system of thought that emphasized traditional ways. The Confucian scholars and writings opposed the sweeping reforms Qin Shihuang was instituting.

Emperor Qin was a powerful man and he knew it. But there was one thing that Emperor Qin knew he did not control death.

All his life, according to the historians, Emperor Qin was obsessed with the idea of eternal life. He had all his magicians and astrologers working on the problem. He went to great lengths to thwart the evil spirits who he believed were preventing him

from finding the answer. One way he tried to do this was by building 270 palaces and connecting them all with passageways so that only a few people (or spirits) would ever know where he was at any time.

As was the custom of his time, Qin Shihuang began building his tomb as soon as he became emperor. Historians who wrote a hundred years later say the tomb was fabulously rich and extravagant, the inner sanctum of a great spirit city Emperor Qin had prepared for his afterlife.

The tomb was also said to be booby trapped with loaded crossbows to shoot anyone who dared enter. And, presumably, Emperor Qin placed the clay army along the road to his tomb to protect him from spirit invaders.

In spite of all his efforts and expense, Emperor Qin obviously didn't find immortality. He died in 210 B.C. and was buried in the tomb he had spent his life building. His great empire died with him, for his advisers conspired to put a weak son into power who could not hold the empire together.

Yet the clay warriors remain. Most of the paint has peeled off and the wooden chariots have long since rotted, but the individual faces of the warriors bear a mute testimony to the man who

accomplished so much.

Examples of the clay soldiers have been exhibited in various countries. If you see them, you may almost want to reach out and pat the neck of one of the sturdy, yet friendly-looking, chariot horses, or have a word with one of the officers whose unseeing eyes have stared for 22 centuries. It is a fascinating encounter with a bit of China's past.

# Losing Weight Without Gimmicks

Dieting.

The word brings to mind images of strange foods, miracle pills or magic gimmicks that claim to melt fat away with almost no effort. It may also conjure up hunger pangs for the millions of people who have tried diets by the dozen in an unending battle of the bulge.

Is there a way to lose weight safely and permanently? A new theory, the setpoint theory, suggests that a part of the brain chooses the amount of fat the body needs and then does everything it can to retain that fat.

What this means, according to setpoint theory, is that when you diet, your body adjusts itself to protect its fat level. You may find that you are continually hungry when you're dieting. This is your body's way of encouraging you to build its fat supplies back up.


It is possible to lose weight by ignoring hunger, but you may find yourself engaged in a continual battle to keep your weight down. Is there an alternative to a life of dieting?

This new theory suggests that, in order to lose weight, you must lower your body's setpoint. And it is impossible to do this solely through dieting.

First, you must increase the amount of exercise you get. A good program of aerobic exercise (like running, swimming or brisk walking) will decrease the amount of fat your body thinks it needs. Make sure you get at least 30 minutes of exercise three times a week.

Second, alter what you eat. This may mean changing the type of foods as well as the amount you eat. Cut down on foods high in fat and sugar and refined or highly processed foods. Along with meat, poultry, fish and dried beans, include milk or other dairy products. Add fruits, vegetables and whole grains. Strive for well-balanced, nutritionally sound meals.

Third, don't measure success only on the scale. When you increase your exercise level, your body will begin trading some of its fat for muscle. Since muscle weighs more than fat, your weight may actually go up as you slim down. Instead of



relying only on the scale, use a tape measure or your gradually shrinking clothes size to measure your success.

Have patience as you work toward your goal. This isn't a three-day miracle diet; it's a change in the way you live. It may be weeks or months before you reach your goal.

But first, make sure you really need to lose weight. Are you really as fat as you think you are? Or are you just

responding to peer pressure to reach an unrealistic goal?

The thin Hollywood ideal of beauty isn't necessarily the right one. Remember that people don't all come in the same shape and size, and were not meant to. No amount of dieting can change the basic structure of your body. Even more important, striving to meet that "ideal" could harm your health.

Don't treat your health lightly. Make your entire health program a sensible one. — By Kerri Miles and Lowell Wagner



When was the last time you gave someone else this special gift?



# Teen Bible Study

# How God Can Become Real to You

Are you like many people who say, "I believe in God, but He seems so distant — so unreal to me"?

Have you wondered: "Where is God? Has He gone off somewhere? Why doesn't He show Himself in some way? How can an invisible God be real to me?"

But think about it for a moment. Almost everyone already believes in some things that can't be seen. Air, wind and gravity are invisible. Yet these are quite real.

God is composed of spirit and therefore cannot be seen by human eyes. But He does have definite form and shape, and lives in a specific place. This study will show how God can become *very real* to you, and how you can even come to know Him personally!

Before you begin, be sure to get your Bible, a pen or pencil and some paper. Look up, read and then write down the Bible verses in this study. This will help you remember what you will be studying.

1. In the second chapter of Genesis we learn that God warned Adam and Eve not to eat the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil that was in the Garden of Eden. In spite of the warning, they disobeyed — sinned — by taking the forbidden fruit (Genesis 3:1-6, 17). What did they do when they heard God walking in the garden? Genesis 3:8.

They hid from God! God had been teaching the first man and woman. He wanted them to get to know Him and His way of life. But when they disobeyed, they felt guilty and wanted to *hide* from Him.

2. In the days of Moses, what did the Israelites do after God spoke to them from Mt. Sinai? Exodus 20:18-19.

When the people heard the thunder and saw the lightning and other evidence of the almighty God, "they trembled and stood afar off." Here were human beings wanting to cut off contact with God. They were telling God, who was very real to them then, to leave them alone.

This is typical of how mankind has been reacting to God since the incident in the Garden of Eden. Ever since Adam, the world in general has been playing the game of hide-and-seek with God.

3. What is God compared to? I John 1:5. Is this why people have tried to hide from God and even claim He does not exist? John 3:19-20. Have they cut themselves off from God because of their sins? Isaiah 59:2.

Everyone since Adam and Eve has sinned by breaking God's law (Romans 3:23, I John 3:4). Humanity is accustomed to living a way of life the Bible refers to as "darkness." But God never sins. His way of life is like a bright light that shows the way out of darkness, or sin. But because people like the darkness, they hide from the light of God.

4. What is one of the things Jesus Christ did while on earth? John 1:18.

Jesus, one of the two eternal members of the God Family, came to earth to reveal God the Father to us, as well as to die for the sins of all mankind.

5. Besides the many revelations from God that are written in the Bible, is there another way we can understand the invisible things of God and the absolute reality of His existence? Romans 1:19-20.

Think about the physical universe and all that it contains. From the forces that bind atomic nuclei and fuel gigantic stars, to the laws that sustain incredibly huge galaxies; from our marvelous, life-sustaining earth, to the vastness of space; from the beauty and intricacy of the observable creation, to our incredibly complex minds that can try to comprehend it — all are awe-inspiring evidence of the existence and power of an almighty, universe-ruling Creator!

6. Since the evidence of God is clearly seen everywhere in His creation, why isn't God real to most people today? Have they become willingly ignorant of the reality of God? Romans 1:21-25. How does God describe one who refuses such obvious

proof of His existence? Verse 22, Psalm 14:1.

The ancient philosophers knew that a Creator God exists. They examined the world around them and discovered order, harmony, system and design. God was in this sense revealed to them, because the existence of order, harmony, system and design absolutely demand a supreme Architect and Designer — a supreme Creator!

But these same men flatly rejected the evidence rather than answer to a higher authority. For if they had admitted God exists, they would have had to *obey* Him! So they "suppressed," or held back, the truth in unrighteousness (Romans 1:18). They convinced themselves, against the facts and their own better judgment, that God doesn't exist. Those who reject such obvious evidence indeed look foolish to God.


7. How did God reveal His incredible greatness, power and wisdom to Job? Job 38:1-6. (God's speech to Job continues through the end of chapter 41.)

Many today are like Job in this way. He thought he knew a lot about God. He was pretty well convinced about God's existence. But then God personally spoke to Job

from a whirlwind and pointed out a few things he hadn't considered before.

God focused Job's mind on His physical creation by asking him a series of questions about the creation he could not answer. Before these questions, Job had talked about God at great length. But God had not been absolutely real to him.

8. Was Job really shaken up after he finally came to see God in a completely new light? Job 42:1-6.

Job had now, for the first time, come to a

true picture of the awesome Creator, the almighty God. Job was now humbled and deeply convinced of the absolute reality of the great, all-powerful Creator God!

9. Can those who seek to become personally acquainted with this same God really find Him? Isaiah 55:6-7. But must one put forth diligent effort to seek Him in a personal way? Hebrews 11:6, last part. Is God not far from anyone who will earnestly seek Him? Acts 17:27.

Yes, you can get to know God. God is interested in and available to His human creation. He is not too busy to hear the prayers of people who really want to know Him. But one must put forth effort to seek God.

10. Will God bless those who truly seek Him wholeheartedly, and desire to actually do His will? Psalm 119:2, I John 3:22.

God is as near as the next fervent, sincere prayer. Those who seek God earnestly will be blessed, both in this life and on into eternity.

Once you come face to face with the reality of God's existence and have a glimpse of His goodness and power, you can begin to *trust* Him to bless you (Hebrews 11:6).

11. But do you realize that our conversation with God is not one-sided? How does God speak to us today? Hebrews 1:1-2.

God has revealed His will and plan for humanity through Jesus Christ. He then inspired various men to record the words of Jesus for us today (II Timothy 3:16-17). And so we are able to learn about God and His purpose for humanity through His written Word.

In a very personal way, God reveals Himself and speaks to us through the Bible. We become acquainted with God by talking to Him in prayer and by reading what He says to us in the Bible.

By reading the Bible, we can come to know the mind of God. We can understand His character and how He thinks. Through His inspired written Word, God shows us how we can have happy, productive lives — He tells us what He has promised to do for us if we seek to do His will.

So get acquainted with the great Creator, Ruler and Sustainer of the entire universe. Begin to understand the great love and wisdom of the living God who takes great delight in those who seek to know Him, talk to Him, love and obey Him!

# Dear Youth 84,

## Practical Bible-based answers to the problems of growing up.

Q. Is kissing wrong for teenagers?

A. We'll go way out on a limb on this one. Our mailboxes may be jammed to overflowing, since many of you are going to disagree. But Youth 84 will not dodge issues. Here is the plain truth on this subject.

Kissing was designed by God to be a manner in which a husband and wife express their feelings, emotion and love for one another. It is part of the sexual stimulus and response mechanism that belongs in the wholesomeness of sex within marriage.

By no means does kissing have to always lead to sexual activity, but it is a manner of expressing love and feeling. If it weren't that way, it wouldn't be fun. Kissing one you love is fun and exciting. It's designed by God that way.

But romantic kissing is not for teens.

Of course family members show affection for one another by kissing. But there is an obvious difference between a boy kissing his mom good-bye before leaving for the evening and the way he may romantically want to kiss his girl friend.

A sister may give a congratulatory kiss for something her brother accomplished. That's perfectly normal. Children kiss their parents and grandparents. All well and good.

But kissing passionately and romantically on teenage dates? It simply shouldn't be done. If that sounds like we at Youth 84 live in another century, well, that's just the way it will have to sound. Save romantic kissing for the proper time and the right person in your life. You'll always be glad you did!

Q. My parents have bad feelings about one of my friends. They don't want me to hang around with her. I think they are prejudiced and wrong. What do you think?

A. This is not an uncommon family problem. And the answer is not as simple as it may at first seem.

First of all, the Bible gives us this instruction: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother,' which is the first commandment with promise: 'that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth'" (Ephesians 6:1-3).

Your parents often see a character flaw or weakness in someone

develop bad habits or make a serious mistake if you spend time with a person they have doubts about.

You really should listen to your parents. Try to discuss why they feel as they do. Doing this may help your family communications greatly.

Maybe you can help correct an error if they have misjudged your friend. But you must be willing to hear them out and listen carefully to their advice.

Remember the old adage, "One rotten apple spoils the whole bunch."

Solomon said, "He who walks with wise men will be wise, but the companion of fools will be destroyed" (Proverbs 13:20). That's what your parents are afraid of.

Many a young person has been influenced to do terribly wrong things by a seeming friend.

If your friends spend some time at your home getting acquainted with your family, your parents will be in a much better position to judge their character and advise you about spending time with them. If they get to know your friends, your parents won't have to judge on circumstantial evidence or out of fear of the unknown.

The world refuses to face the tragic TRUTH!


The TRUE answer is this:

the universe.

A third of the angels followed him in warlike aggression to knock God off His throne, and take over the UNIVERSE rule. But they were driven back to the earth. Physical chaos struck the earth as a result of this stupendous mutiny. In six days God restored the earth, and created MANKIND upon it (Psalm 104:30).

God made man mortal, of material substance. But He gave man MIND power. When man chose to disobey God — to do evil

— his mind became hostile toward God. He imbibed Satan's attitude of SELF and rebellion. This became HUMAN NATURE. Human nature includes the attitude that had become Satan's (Lucifer's name now changed to Satan).

Human nature is a PULL, like the power of gravity, in the direction of vanity, greed, selflove and spirit of competition, hostility, indifference, resentment or hatred, toward others. That is man's natural attitude and tendency. It is a constant PULL on man in that direction. It

is the WAY THAT COMES NATURALLY. Because a subtile Satan, still on earth's throne, begins injecting that attitude during the first year of infant life.

# Human nature — minus purpose!

Let's understand the real basic reason for these present problems. Basically, it is simply human nature.

Yet God endowed man with MIND power, capable of recognizing the error of this WAY, if willing. Adam could have obeyed God, resisted Satan and qualified to replace Satan as earth RULER, administering the GOVERNMENT OF God. But Adam disobeyed God, succumbed to Satan. His children have done so ever since.

Can't we see the handwriting on the wall?

WHY all this violence — this immorality?

HERE IS THE CAUSE! HUMAN NATURE — WHICH IS VANITY — without any PURPOSE, and absence of parental training and discipline!

There is no sense of PUR-POSE today. We are told we must adjust to living in a world of problems with no solutions! Nuclear war — the erasure of human life from the earth — appears to be just around the corner — liable to strike us any second.

Young people today are given NOTHING TO LIVE FOR! NO HOPE! NO FUTURE! They are more prosperous than ever before. They are BORED! They are rebellious. The spirit of REVOLT is in the air! They resent all AUTHORITY!

Yet VANITY within them seeks to exalt itself!

WHY do aimless, purposeless, bored, yet prosperous teenagers resort to violence?

Said an article in Reader's Digest: "Boys explode into violence to prove they are grown up. Some, unable to succeed in school... seek status through hooliganism."

There it is — "TO SEEK STATUS" — plain VANITY, but minus any constructive or healthy PURPOSE!

Their parents have FAILED!


One father said of his boy in police trouble: "It isn't my fault! Why, I've always given him everything he wanted. I can't understand WHY he did this terrible thing!"

Yes, this father gave him MONEY. But he failed to give him right teaching, training, a PUR-

POSE in life, proper discipline, instilling in this boy a sense of responsibility and respect for authority! And he probably denied him love and true fatherson companionship! Also he failed to teach him the TRUTH about SEX!

## Teenagers need factual instruction

It is not exactly a paradox that millions of teenagers have had considerable sex experience, and yet possess little sexual knowledge. It is largely because of ignorance — or lack of right

instruction in the right manner at the right time — that adolescents seek to satisfy curiosity by experience. And, of course, they are "sheep," and when it becomes a trend — when "it's being done" — human nature wants "to belong." So they go with the crowd — and parents know nothing of it.

Even when growing children and adolescents do receive some formal sex education, it is always presented from the physical, the material and, therefore, the sensual approach. If teenagers had been properly taught what they needed to know about sex, from the very first and second years of their lives, by informed and loving parents, the frightful tragedies of teenage and premarital sex would have been reduced to the barest minimum.

Today, if you tell the average teenager that "necking" is WRONG — that it ought never to be indulged in — that it is a definite SIN — that it robs his or her future marriage of much of its possible joys, delights and blissful happiness — the young man or woman will probably look

at you rather pityingly, wondering how you could be so naive!

He would probably reverse the truth and exclaim: "Why, where have you been, that you don't know the facts of life yet? Why don't you grow up? This is the 20th century!"

Actually, it is the adolescent who is naive, ignorant and untaught in the TRUTH about the facts of life!

### Going steady

The basic cause of today's immorality, of course, is HUMAN NATURE. Human nature is the basic cause of all violence, war, crime — all our troubles in this present evil world!

But, as stated in the beginning of this article, human nature expresses itself in different ways, and adapts itself to changing times.

Human nature is, simply, the subconscious pull of a definite attitude of mind. It is the attitude that became Satan's. It is the natural attitude implanted from infancy by the invisible Satan. It is the attitude of vanity — of self-concern — of lust and greed. It is the attitude of hostility to others, and resentment of authority over it.

Of course, the self, as explained before, expands into the "empireical self" — which includes those with whom individual self is associated, or connected. This may include one's

family, his club, his gang, his church, his country. Patriotism is an example of the "empireical self" expanded to include one's country. But patriotism is expressed in the form of loyalty to country, as opposed to OTHER countries. It includes an automatic hostility toward other countries—either passive or active. The Bible (Moffatt translation) classifies this as "party-spirit" (Galatians 5:20) and one of the "deeds of the flesh"—as opposed to the "fruit of the Spirit."

The natural tendency to want to belong is merely the expression

of this phase of human nature. This leads to the desire to want to go along with those one accepts as his peer group, team, gang or whatever. This nature expresses itself in young people by the natural pull to want to go along with the teens, as opposed to their elders. If the teens have a new custom, frowned on by their elders, then self associates with the teens, and feels automatic and natural (from human nature) hostility and resentment toward the opposing elders.

Now what about going steady? This started several years ago as an American custom. The custom spread. It is a new way started by those in the middle and late teens. But when 18- and

19-year-olds began going steady, 16- and 17-year-olds desired to emulate (Galatians 5:20) and to go along. Then 14- and 15-year-olds responded to the pull to go along, and today even the 12- and 13-year-olds are beginning to go steady.


This subject has been discussed before in this series. Going steady brings familiarity, and familiarity breeds a certain contempt — in this instance, contempt for chastity, virtue and honor.

This going steady is simply the natural response to the *pull* of human nature. Human nature is essentially lazy. When a boy or girl goes steady he feels assured of dates. The boy is spared the

embarrassment of asking new girls for dates, and the possible humiliation of being turned down. The girl feels a sense of security, knowing she will have dates.

The very familiarity of steady dating makes it easier for the boy to make bolder advances in "necking," and then going on further into sexual intercourse. It makes it more difficult for the girl to say NO. It tends to lower bars of resistance, and increases the temptation to carry intimacies to the limit.

The FRUITS of going steady are

definitely not good!

It is one of the most difficult things in the world to convince someone of the wisdom of doing what he ought to do, instead of what he wants to do. But yielding to what one wants to do is surrendering to human nature. It is traveling the road to sin. And sin is man's greatest enemy, inflicting on him every pain, heartache, suffering and anguish he ever experiences. It inflicts unwanted penalties. But, again, it is hard for people to understand why they can't put their hands on

a red-hot stove and not get burned!

Going steady is not good — for those who do it!

Now what about "necking"?

### Is "NECKING" wrong?

To even ask the question, "Is 'necking' wrong?" would sound rather silly to the average adolescent today.

WHY?

Because of *ignorance!* Because of wrong teaching, and a lack of *right teaching!* Because there are some of the *facts of life* they have not yet learned!

Is the Bible an out-of-date book? If it is, how does it happen that it so accurately foretells today's WORLD NEWS — so understandingly pinpoints human nature?

It says, "The carnal mind is hostile toward God." And that is certainly true. Where God says, "Remember," everyone immediately forgets! When Jesus said, "Think not I am come to destroy the law," everyone proceeded to think He DID destroy it! If God, in the Bible, said, "Observe Christmas, New Year's AND Easter," then nobody would!

GOD CREATED HUMAN-KIND male and female. GOD blessed humans with the wonderful God-plane marriage and family relationship.

GOD designed sex, to bring indescribable delights and joys with His blessing, IN MARRIAGE! In His great wisdom, God created men so that sex arousal and desire often takes place more rapidly than in their wives — and He designed women so that they are not physically or mentally prepared for actual coitus until arousal is brought about by the love embrace — by caressing by the love-talk and endearing words of the husband! In other words, by "necking" and "petting."

There was vital PURPOSE in this!

Had God made women to be aroused by the same means and

the same quickness as their husbands, sexual intercourse in marriage would seldom — if ever — be that supreme expression of LOVE that God intended — in order to BIND and HOLD TOGETHER the marriage and the home and family! Marriage would be robbed of its blessings — of its supreme joys!

But when boys and girls engage in premarital lovemaking, called "necking," "petting" and even "heavy petting," it is NOT the love that binds more firmly that which God has bound for life.

It is mere sensual gratification. It is LUST, no matter what you wish to call it! IT CHEAPENS, TARNISHES, CORRODES the entire, wonderful experience God intended as a repeated lifelong experience IN MARRIAGE! And it detracts from, and robs the participants of the full happiness they might have had in a future marriage!

This lovemaking — this "necking" or "petting" — this caressing — is all a PART OF, and actually the most important part of, SEXUAL INTERCOURSE IN MARRIAGE!

#### A capital sin!

Therefore, when indulged in prior to marriage — or outside of marriage — IT IS A CAPITAL SIN!

Teenage CUSTOM does not determine what is SIN!

College-campus practices do not define right and wrong!

Acceptance by society does not decide what is SIN!

GOD ALMIGHTY HAS ALREADY DETERMINED WHAT IS SIN!

God does not allow humans to decide WHAT is sin — but He forces us to decide WHETHER to sin! He has called me to lift up my voice and show people WHAT is sin. That is what I am doing here. I did not devise that LAW, or set it in dynamic, living, if invisible MOTION — GOD DID!

How can you prevent the tragedy of a premarital pregnancy? How can you prevent the disgrace and terrible predicament of venereal disease? By knowing

when to stop? NO! By simply not starting the "necking" in the first place!

If it were GOOD FOR young people, God would have instructed them to engage in it. But SIN is not good for people — SIN HARMS PEOPLE!

In an earlier article we described how people are drawn into sin. It is explained in James 1:14-15: "Every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth SIN: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth DEATH."

The temptation is not a SIN. Sin is when the MIND harbors the temptation — retains it — keeps thinking of it — keeps desiring it, UNTIL the desire conceives into the ACTION of SIN. How does one avoid sin? By NOT RETAINING THE DESIRE! By pushing it out of mind immediately!

But to start in the action of sin, and think you can "draw the line" — that you know "when to stop" is to COMMIT SIN!

The time to PREVENT SIN is before it starts!

This world's society and its customs are based on human nature — which is to say, on SATAN's ways — and are diametrically CONTRARY to God's ways!

Go along with the crowd, and you are stumbling along with the other dumb sheep to the SLAUGHTER! Why be one of the CROWD? Why not stand out from the crowd of ignoramuses and weaklings, as one who has knowledge, wisdom and CHARACTER! Any old dead fish can float downstream but it takes a *live* one to swim *against* the current!

This is not prudish talk. It is not old-fashioned talk. It is intelligent, rational UNDERSTANDING, based on the instruction of the Creator!

What a shame that the adolescents of today were not taught properly by their parents from babyhood!

It is THE GOD-REQUIRED DUTY of every parent — a responsibility for which parents will be held accountable IN THE JUDGMENT — to properly teach

and inform their children of the FACTS of sex.

This teaching ought to begin while children are still small.

### Dating, a lost art?

Has dating become a lost art?
It would certainly seem so.
Certainly there is no art to the
manner of dating today.

It seems young people no longer know what to do with themselves on dates. Perhaps most dates today are spent either in a car, parked by the roadside in a dark and secluded spot, where the time is spent in "necking," or in sexual intercourse, or else in a darkened motion-picture theater letting their minds drift with a ready-made daydream.

Dating is no longer stimulating mentally, upbuilding socially and intellectually beneficial. It tends not to build but to destroy character. Some dating, of course, is spent at various kinds of dances. Some of these may be invigorating physically and at least somewhat mentally. Some are downgrading and morally and mentally harmful — depending on environment and character and quality of participants.

In my dating days, I had a "system." I was unconverted, and the motive undoubtedly, in part at least, was vanity. But I did try to date only top-level girls. Of course we sometimes went to the theater, occasionally to the motion pictures (it was during the "silent" days), occasionally to a dance — but never to a public dance. Public dances, then, were not in good repute.

But usually our date involved a walk, a scintillating and enlightening conversation, and possibly a soda or sundae at an ice cream parlor. I devoted considerable time in public libraries, in the philosophical or travel or biography departments, acquiring knowledge for interesting conversation.

On a first date I analyzed and sized up the girl. I didn't know how a fellow "fell in love," but I supposed it might happen unexpectedly in some mysterious way.

And I didn't want it to happen to me in the case of an unqualified girl. If my first-date appraisal of the girl indicated definitely that, should I "fall" for her, she would be unsuitable as a wife and the mother of my children, there was never a second date.

I was taking no chances on "falling" overboard with the wrong girl to the point I might be so blinded by love I would be unable to see it!

I remember one girl, pretty, attractive, good conversationalist. She got a second date. But then I discovered she was lazy, would not help her mother with dishes, making beds and housework. I never dated her again.

I dated two or three girls, frequently but not regularly or like going steady in any sense, who had absolutely no "sex appeal" for me whatsoever. There would have been no temptation to "neck" as teens call it today. Of one I said I would as soon have my arms around a cold iron lamp post. Yet I dated her on occasion because she was an unusually fine girl whom I respected highly and an interesting conversationalist.

Dating can and ought to be made a real art. Some thinking and planning ought to go into the preparation for a date. A date should be an event that adds to the mental, social, moral and spiritual character development of both boy and girl. Such a date is so much more rewarding, and leaves a far more palatable feeling afterward. In today's warped and perverted thinking I suppose that suggestion seems very old-fashioned and naive. But for those who have a little sense and understanding, it would be wise to heed it.

adjustments he had made, including leaving his old school to go to a special school for the handicapped. He had to make new friends and accept how to deal with his handicap at the school.


He spoke to me with a serious note in his voice as he said, "I just thank God every day I'm still alive to enjoy the rest of my life."

Have you ever heard of processionary caterpillars? These little creatures move through the trees in long, trainlike processions. One leads and the others follow, each with its sad eyes half closed and its head snugly fitted against the rear extremity of the caterpillar in front of it.

French naturalist Jean Henri Fabre, after hours of patiently experimenting with a line of processionary caterpillars, finally enticed them onto the rim of a large flowerpot. They would no doubt have continued longer, had it not been for sheer exhaustion and final starvation. There was ample food close at hand and plainly visible, but outside the range of the circle, and the caterpillars refused to abandon the well-beaten path.

These little fellows were doing their thing, loyally but blindly following instinct and habit, right to the end.

The caterpillars' mistake? They mistook activity for accomplishment. They surely meant well, but got no place.

By the way: Do you have a goal? What kinds of goals do you have?

We all need goals. Ask yourself: Why is it that some

people seem to get more done than others? Don't we all have the same amount of time?
